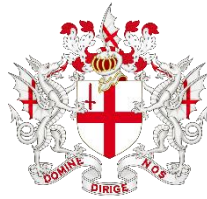

Champagne reception and tour of the Old Bailey, 26th July 2018

The Recorder of London, His Honour Judge Nicholas Hilliard QC, also Master of the Feltmakers, is holding a fund-raising event at the Old Bailey on Thursday, July 26, 2018, from 6-8.30pm in aid of the Sheriffs' and Recorder's Fund. There will be a champagne reception with canapes, tours of the Old Bailey and a chance to see the newly refurbished number 1 court. Tickets for the event are £35, but you are asked to make a minimum donation to the Sheriffs' and Recorder's Fund of £35 per ticket as well. The Feltmakers' Company are acting as the coordinators for this event (nothing else), on behalf of the Sheriffs' & Recorder's Fund, and do so with the full permission of its Chairman and Trustees. The dress is lounge suits and equivalent for the women.

Many of you will, hopefully, have never seen inside the Old Bailey. The Recorder of London, His Honour Judge Nicholas Hilliard, QC, in conjunction with the Sheriffs' & Recorder's Fund, has very kindly made the Old Bailey available for a rare opportunity to look inside on the 26th July 2018.

The Sheriffs' & Recorder's Fund

Founded in 1808, the Fund gives small grants to ex-prisoners and their families in London, to help them stop offending and start a new life.

The British prison population is over 86,000. On release, prisoners receive £46. Lacking money, education, a job, a stable family life and a home, over 70% re-offend. Their life is spent in and out of prison.

The Sheriffs' & Recorder's Fund helps to break this vicious cycle, at the critical time when a prisoner is released. The Fund gives small grants to supply a vital need, It also gives larger grants to prison-based charitable schemes which work towards the rehabilitation of ex-prisoners; it also makes grants to ex-offenders for clothing, household furnishings, training courses and tools of trade.
