

PLUMBER'S APPRENTICE DAY and ROYAL CHARTER COMMEMORATION

On **Wednesday 19th April** the Master, Wardens and Court of the Worshipful Company of Plumbers will convene on the concourse of Cannon Street railway station, to mark the anniversary of our Grant of Royal Charter in April 1611 and to celebrate the historic and continuing role of our Company in encouraging young people to train and qualify in our profession.

A ceremony will be held at 11:45 in front of the Plumber's Apprentice statue, at which bursaries awarded by our Charitable and Educational Trust will be presented to four deserving students from Croydon College, accompanied by Tom Collins, Assistant Principal, and Liveryman and Lecturer Peter Cheesman. We shall also visit the commemorative plaque at the station entrance.

After the ceremony, we shall have lunch at "The Banker" on the riverside 3 minutes' walk from Cannon St station. The cost of the luncheon is £30 including wine, coffee or tea. Payment will be taken on the day. (There is no charge for attending the ceremony.)

This promises to be a very convivial and informal event, which may become an annual fixture in the Company's calendar. **Liverymen, consorts and guests** are welcome to join Court and Committee Members to celebrate our history and reaffirm our commitment to supporting young people training for a career in plumbing.
