Dear Liverymen and Freemen,

Quarterage for the Livery Year Beginning 30th September 2017 – Request for Payment

At the July 2017 Court meeting it was agreed that the full Quarterage rate for the forthcoming year should be set at £380.00 including VAT (where applicable). Accordingly the new rates are:

Full Membership	£380.00 including VAT of £63.33
Veteran: Post 1 st October 2008 (75%)	£285.00 including VAT of £47.50
Emeritus/Veteran: Pre 1 st October 2008 (50%)	£190.00 including VAT of £31.67
Young Entry Scheme (50%)	£190.00 including VAT of £31.67
Freeman (50%)	£190.00 including VAT of £31.67
International (25%)	£95.00

Notes:

- To qualify for the 50% Veteran rate you must have either been:
 - a Liveryman since 1st October 1988 **and** have a date of birth before 1st October 1938 **or**
 - a Liveryman for 30 years and reached the age of 80.
- To qualify for the 75% rate you must have been a Liveryman for 25 years **and** reached the age of 75.
- The Young Entry Scheme (YES) includes all Liverymen up to the age of 40.
- The International category covers all Liverymen living overseas outside the United Kingdom, Isle of Man and Channel Islands.

If you are uncertain into which category you fall, please telephone the office. We would greatly prefer all quarterage to be paid by Direct Debit as cheque payment adds to our costs; please contact the office and we will send you the necessary forms.

If you pay by Direct Debit Instructions the appropriate sum will be collected on 1st October 2017. For those who pay by cheque, please make it payable to "The Worshipful Company of Plumbers" and forward to the office by **30th September 2017**. International members are also asked to pay by International bank transfer by the same date.

Please note you will not receive a separate invoice and that this letter should be taken as such.
