1365 Ordinances granted in the reign of Edward III  
1488 Further Ordinances granted relating to journeymen and conduct of work  
1520 Ordinances of 1488 confirmed, in which it was also ordained that the King's Plumber (the Sergeant Plumber) should sit with the Wardens at their meetings.  
1588 24 November - Grant of Arms and Crest  
1611 12 April - Plumbers Charter granted in the reign of James I  
1611 11 November - Oaths and Ordinances granted in the reign of James I  
1666 Chequers Yard Livery Hall destroyed by fire  
1669 Hall rebuilt  
1863 Hall compulsorily purchased and site developed as Cannon Street Railway Station  
1883 Company inaugurates National Register of Plumbers  
1886 Voluntary Register of Plumbers instituted
